How Do My Old Windows Lose Heat In The Winter And Cool Air In The Summer?

Your existing windows are probably the biggest source of energy loss in your home, and that means replacing them is a great opportunity to save on your fuel and maintenance bills.

There are two major causes of energy loss through old windows-infiltration and conduction. Infiltration occurs when cold air slips around the frame and through the small opening between frame and sash, forcing warm air from inside your home to outside. Conduction is the transfer of heat from your home through the glass and frame to the cold outside air.

During summer, cool air is lost through the same infiltration and conduction processes in reverse. Also, your home accumulates additional heat due to radiation, or heat build-up caused by the sun's rays. Infiltration, conduction and radiation can be minimized by installing snug-fitting, insulating vinyl windows.
