Despite the fine outing by Mintz, it wasn't the best pitching performance of the week for the Scorpions.

Last Tuesday, McBride tossed a no-hitter and North Brunswick defeated Bladenboro 4-0 in a Three Rivers Conference game in Leland.

The right-handed McBride, who is 5-2 on the season, recorded 13 strikeouts against the visiting Bulldogs. He had a perfect game going until he walked a batter in

McBride also sparked the Scorpion offense. He led off the fourth inning with a triple and came home on Robert Hewett's RBI single. The Scorpions added three runs in the sixth.




