South Columbus jumped out to a 10-3 lead and held off a late rally to beat West Brunswick 10-8 in a Waccamaw Conference high school baseball game last Thursday at Tabor City.

"We played one of the best game we've played, but they were hitting everything we threw at them," West Brunswick Coach Mike Alderson said. "We made a great comeback."

The Trojans trailed 10-3 after four innings before mounting a rally with two runs in the top of the sixth.

In the seventh, West Brunswick got an RBI single from Chris Jackson and a two-out, two-run triple from second baseman Chris Payne to cut the South Columbus lead to 10-8.

After Mike Johnson walked to put runners at the corners, West's Eric

Johnson drove a Whitney Hughes pitch to within five feet of the fence. The ball was caught for the final out. Eric Johnson had three base hits

in the game, including an RBI single in the sixth inning. The junior pitcher/outfielder entered this week with a team-leading .425 batting average.

Payne also had two hits for West Brunswick, and catcher Gabe Cooper went 2-for-4 with an RBI.

Mike Johnson belted a solo home run in the third inning. Phillip Leonard pitched three innings of one-run relief and went 2-for-2 at the plate. West Brunswick left 12 runners

on base. "That's still one of our downfalls. We're getting runners out there with two outs and not driving them in," Alderson said. South Columbus had 17 hits in
