South Fourth In Regional Golf Tourney

South Brunswick placed fourth and West Brunswick took sixth in the 3A Eastern Regional high school golf tournament Monday at Willow Springs Country Club in Wilson.

Led by Tommy Warren's round of 78, the Cougars posted a team total of 329 and missed qualifying for next week's state championships by one place. West Brunswick shot a 334.

South's Warren will compete for the individual state title next Monday and Tuesday at Finley Golf Course in Chapel Hill.

North Lenoir's team shot 311 to win the regional championship. Harnett Central placed second with 314, and West Carteret took third with 316.

South Brunswick had wrapped up its third straight Waccamaw

Conference golf championship last Wednesday by winning a makeup match at Fox Squirrel Country Club.

The Cougars had a 319 to beat West Brunswick by 12 strokes. Whiteville was third with 356, followed by South Columbus with 358, Pender with 361, East Columbus with 362 and West Columbus with 380.

South Brunswick's Jeff Howard had the low round of the day with a 76.

West Brunswick's Juana Jaramillo shot 79 and won the individual conference title with an average of 81.1 strokes per round. South Brunswick's Kevin McKeithan was second with an 81.5 average.

South Brunswick finished the conference season with an overall score of 2,222 and won the team

championship by 39 strokes over second-place West Brunswick.

Other season totals were Whiteville, 2506; South Columbus, 2572; Pender, 2619; West Columbus, 2756; and East Columbus, 2841.
