There is no admission charge, but donations will be accepted. The band is directed by Paul Pittenger.

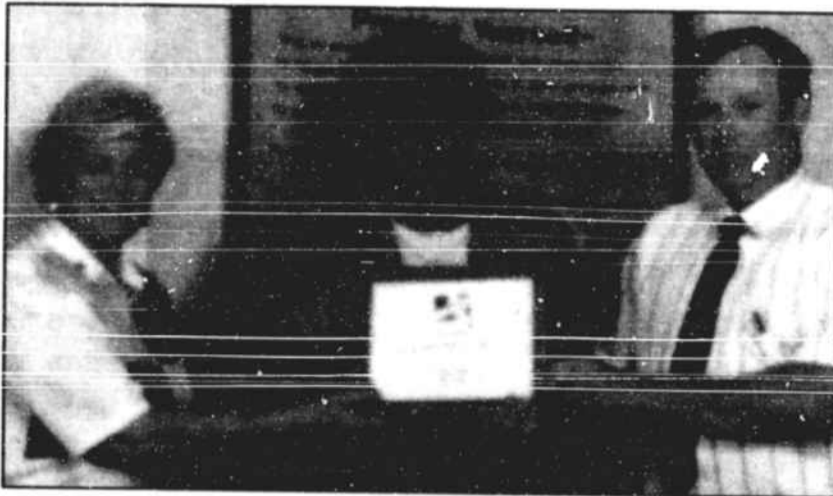
