Registration Begins For State Games Slated Next Month

Registration has begun for participants in the 1994 State Games of North Carolina, a statewide Olympic-style athletic competition for citizens of all ages and skill levels.

Regional competitions will be held June 10-12 in Jacksonville, Raleigh and Asheville. Finals will be held June 18-26 in Durham, where opening ceremonies are planned June 24.

Entry deadlines vary for the 33 athletic events offered at State Games. The earliest deadline is May 23 for cheerleading and gymnastics. Participants in other events can wait at late as mid-June to register.

Any North Carolina resident who has lived in the state at least 30 days prior to the entry deadline is eligible to compete. All participants must be amateurs and abide by eligibility rules governing their sport.

Best Receives Distinguished Service Award At Meeting

Former Brunswick County Schools Athletic Director Nelson Best received the N.C. High School Athletic Association Distinguished Service Award during the group's annual meeting last Thursday in Chapel Hill.

Best served as athletic director for nearly 15 years and retired Jan. 31, one month after the Brunswick County Board of Education decided to eliminate his position effective June 30.

"The Distinguished Service Award is to honor those people who spend a lot of time and effort promoting the value of high school athletics," said Rick Strunk, associate executive director of the NCHSAA.

Best worked for 39 years in education, including 25 in Brunswick County. He served a combined 10 years as principal of Leland and North Brunswick high schools before moving to the central office in 1979.

Best also taught history, science, physical education and health and coached boys' and girls' basketball, baseball, track, football and tennis.

As athletic director, Best has said his greatest accomplishments were acquiring county supplements for all coaches and expanding athletic programs at the middle and high schools.

The NCHSAA Distinguished Service Award has been presented for nine years, and Best was one of 27 award recipients this year, Strunk said.
