Union Elementary Honors Volunteers With Sundial

Union Elementary School hosts a reception every spring and fall for the volunteers who help educate students throughout the school year. This spring, Union decided to do something different.

FINAL ROUNDS MAY 23

Shallotte Middle Advances To Statewide History Bowl

Hands will twitch on buzzers and hearts will beat faster as Shallotte Middle School eighth graders compete in the final rounds of the 11th annual North Carolina History Bowl on Monday, May 23.

Four-student teams representing Shallotte Middle and seven other schools will face off in single elimination rounds from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. in Raleigh.

The bowl is the culmination of months spent studying North Carolina history and successfully competing in regional bowls sponsored by state historic sites earlier this year.

Coached by social studies teacher Faye Rogers, Shallotte Middle School won the Brunswick Town State Historic Site Regional History Bowl to advance to the state contest. Other schools competing in the

state bowl are Arendell Parrott Academy, Kinston; Carmel Middle School, Charlotte; James K. Polk Memorial; Harnett Central Middle School, Angier; Miller's Creek Intermediate School, Wilkes County; Neal Middle School, Durham; Northwest Middle School, Greensboro; and R.S. Middle School, Rutherford County.

Competition will take place in the State Archives Auditorium at 109 East Jones Street in downtown Raleigh and will be open to the public.

Students will arrive May 22 for a tour of the new state Museum of History and attend a reception at the headquarters of the United Daughters of the Confederacy (UDC).

The event is sponsored by the Historic Sites Section of the Department of Cultural Resources, and the UDC.

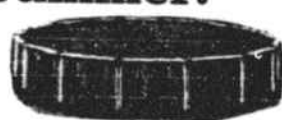

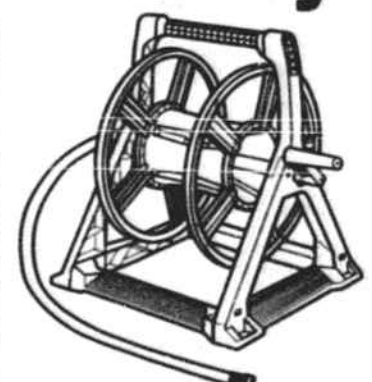
