MALCOLM H. ROURK, M.D.

Malcolm Henderson Rourk, M.D., of Village Road, Shallotte, died May 12 in The Brunswick Hos-pital.

He was born June 20, 1903, in Wilmington, a son of the late Will-iam Asbury and Sarah Helen Stone Rourk.

He was first married to the late Marie Foscoe. Dr. and Mrs. Rourk donated property for the West Brunswick Branch Library, the Masonic Lodge, the National Guard Armory, the County Health Department (now the Seniors Center), the expansion of Shallotte Presbyterian Church and many other churches in the Shallotte area. They were instrumental in bringing the N.C. Symphony to Brunswick County for many years.

Dr. Rourk served as team doctor and gave to the building and athletic programs at Shallotte High School. He was on the local school commit-tee and the county board of educa-tion for 26 years. He helped save Sunnyside School from destruction.

He was a 1924 graduate of the University of North Carolina, a 1926 graduate of the UNC School of Medicine and a 1928 graduate of the University of Minnesota, where he studied under the Mayo brothers. He attended Harvard University in 1934 under a Ford Foundation Fellowship and served in the Army Medical Corps in the United States and Southwest Pacific during World War II. He was a colonel at the time of separation.

Dr. Rourk practiced medicine for 42 years and was the first physician in Brunswick County to have an electrograph. He was a 32nd degree Mason, Scottish and York Rites; a Shriner; and had served on local and state levels. He had been involved with Lions International since 1939 and had served as international di-rector from 1964-66.

Dr. Rourk was a charter member of Shallotte Presbyterian Church and the Dunes Golf and Beach Club in Myrtle Beach.

Survivors include his wife, Jane Davis Rourk of Durham; a son, Dr. Malcolm Henderson Rourk Jr. of Durham; a daughter, Marie Foscoe Rourk Harrison of Shallotte; eight grandchildren; and 13 great-grandchildren.
