Gore To Be Fourth Fest Grand Marshal

Lt. Harry W. Gore Jr. has been chosen parade marshal for this year's N.C. Fourth of July Festival in Southport.

The festival, to take place July 1-4, is the state's official observance of Independence Day.

Gore, 45, is the son of Harry W. Gore Sr. of Scuthport and Olivia Sloan Gore of Wilmington. He was graduated from Hampton High School in 1968 and from Virginia Military Institute in 1972 with a bachelor's degree in math and a commission into the U.S. Air Force as a second lieutenant.

Gore entered active duty and attended undergraduate pilot training at Craig Air Force Base in Selma, Ala., and remained at the base after becoming a T-37 instructor pilot. His next assignment took him to Charleston Air Force Base in South Carolina, where he piloted C-141 transports. During this time he traveled extensively, primarily through Europe and the Middle East, as well as to Asia, Africa and South Amer-

After earning a master's degree in applied mathematics from N.C. State University, Gore served a fouryear tour on the faculty of the U.S. Air Force Academy. He next assignment was at Travis AFB, Calif., where he resumed flying C-141 transports. From there, he traveled throughout the Pacific, with occatrips to Europe, South America and Australia.

McMillan Funds **UNC Lecture Series**

helping the oppressed, protecting free speech and allowing students to play responsible roles in university affairs.

The new Frank Porter Graham lecture series at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill honors the former UNC president by addressing the persistence of poverty, either in body or spirit, and suggesting ways a democratic society can deal with its causes and effects. The series also provides a forum for diverse speakers and gives students a major role in selecting them.

The series was established this spring with a \$150,000 gift from Taylor McMillan of Raleigh and Holden Beach, a 1960 UNC-CH honors graduate and retired chief deputy commissioner of the N.C. Department of Labor. Dedicated to the memory of his parents, Neill Archibald and Rhoda Theima Holden McMillan, the series is housed in Carolina's College of Arts and Sciences. The first lecture will be held next year.

Graham, UNC president from 1930 to 1949, served in the U.S. Senate from 1949 to 1950.

Dr. Frank, perhaps more than any other person, defined education, culture and politics in North Carolina in the 20th century," McMillan said. "Those of us who remember him want to make sure his memory means something to future North Carolinians.

McMillan said he hopes lecturers will have a variety of beliefs and backgrounds, be drawn from the

Frank Porter Graham believed in continuum of liberal to conservative thought, and come from backgrounds ranging from religion and the arts to politics and economics.

Because Graham had "an abiding confidence and trust in the ability of students to play a responsible role in the affairs of the university,' McMillan said, students will play a major role in selecting the lecture


McMillan was an orator at Carolina, and he felt a lecture series was an appropriate way to honor Graham. A member of Phi Beta Kappa, McMillan was president of the university debate squad and winner of the Willie P. Mangum Medal in Oratory.

McMillan is a native of Parkton. He received a master's degree in political science from Yale University, where he was a Woodrow Wilson Fellow, and a law degree from the University of Chicago. This year he completed more than 15 years as chairman of the Holden Beach Interdenominational Chapel Board of Trustees.

McMillan's gift counts toward the \$400 million Bicentennial Campaign for Carolina, the university's largest fund-raising effort, which concludes in June 1995.
