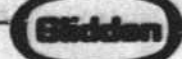

Hospice Hosts Open House At New Pine Street Office

Lower Cape Fear Hospice will host an open house Sunday, June 5, from 2-5 p.m. at its new Shallotte office, 112 Pine Street.

Hospice has relocated to the former optometry office of Chris Moshoures.

The hospice staff of nurses, certified nursing aides, social workers, counselors, chaplains, and administrative and community relations staff are inviting the public and Brunswick County hospice volunteers to the event.

Lower Cape Fear Hospice was founded in 1980 to serve patients in New Hanover, Brunswick and Pender counties. In 1987, the first Brunswick County office was opened in Shallotte. The staff moved into its new office in March.

Lower Cape Fear Hospice provides health care which emphasized pain relief and symptom control when patient cure is not possible. Focusing on the physical, emotional, social and spiritual needs of patients and their families, the program provides health care in the home or in a homelike setting.

It is a community-based, not-for-profit health care agency governed by a board of directors. Its mission is to provide "compassionate, cost-effective, quality care for patients with life-limiting illnesses and their families."

Lower Cape Fear Hospice is licensed by the state and is certified to

accept Medicare and Medicaid. It is a provider member of Hospice for the Carolinas and National Hospice and is a member agency of Cape Fear Area and Onslow United Way.

The organization is supported by memorial gifts, contributions from individuals and groups, private and public grants, and by fundraising events.

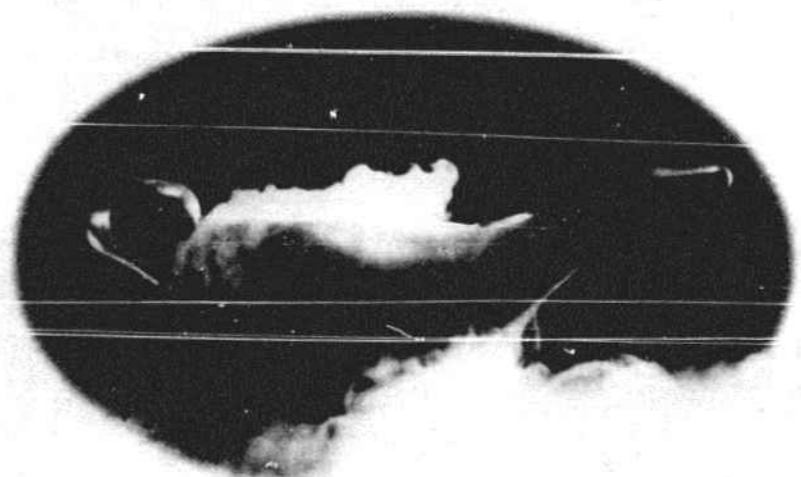
