Health Fair Focus Extends To Include Entire Family

The Brunswick Hospital's 5th annual health fair June 18 promises to be a family affair this year.

In the past the fair has focused almost entirely on children's health. This year more exhibits will be geared toward adults and seniors, said Daphne Yarbrough, director of marketing, though it should still have plenty of kid appeal.

The fair will take place rain or shine from noon until 2 p.m. at The Brunswick Hospital on U.S. 17 at Supply. Hospital departments will join area health agencies and not-forprofit organizations in offering educational materials, blood pressure, glucose and cholesterol checks, and eye and dental screenings, along with free food and gifts for all who attend.

Exhibitors will include dentists Greg Rupp and E. Harvie Hill, the American Red Cross, March of Dimes, American Cancer Society, Hospice of the Lower Cape Fear, Comprehensive Home Health Care, Carolina Eye Associates, Coastal Carolinas Pain Center, Shallotte Volunteer Rescue Squad, Supply Volunteer Fire Department and the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) Program.

The hospital's labor, delivery and family center will offer information on childbirth classes, prenatal care

Barring any emergencies, tours will be offered of the surgery and endoscopy units and the wastewater treatment plant.

Staff members and other exhibitors will provide educational materials related to the detection and treatment of a variety of health conditions from diabetes to breast cancer. Drawings will be held for two free mammograms and limited EKG and X-ray demonstrations or screenings will be provided.

Two "crash dummies" will educate the public on driving safety, while the Brunswick Shores Mental Health Center will provide educational materials relating to diagnosis and treatment of conditions such as depression.

Face painting will be offered for children and the N.C. Highway Patrol will participate with its drug detection dog.
