# Teens Highlight Big Week At Piers

Two teen-agers highlighted a fantastic week of pier fishing in the South Brunswick Islands, pulling in a huge cobia and a mammoth king mackerel as more experienced anglers looked on

Billy Green of Supply landed a 68-pound cobia at Holden Beach Fishing Pier on Sunday, according to manager Gil Bass.

Last week at Sunset Beach Fishing Pier, 15-year-old Kyle Eaton of Coshockton, Ohio, landed a total of five king mackerel, including one that weighed 44 pounds.

"We're trying to get him to start giving lessons to some of the oldtimers," pier manager Ed Kayler said Monday.

In addition to Eaton's kings, anglers also pulled in spots, bluefish, flounder, whiting, Spanish mackerel, pompano, trout and pinfish last week at Sunset Pier. A 22-pound king mackerel was landed Monday.

"All in all it's been a pretty good fishing week," Kayler said. "Not bad for springtime at all."

At Holden Beach Pier, Bass said anglers caught lots of Spanish mackerel and flounder last week, along with some blues, whiting and spots. Linda Burns of Waxhaw landed a

28-pound king Sunday. On Saturday, Mike Elks pulled in a 14-pounder and a 20-pounder. At Ocean Isle Beach Fishing Pier, fishermen caught flounder, blues

and sheepshead last week, said manager Milton Williams. 'They've been catching some nice speckled trout on live shrimp," he added. "Fishing overall is still


