

Phillips-Norton Ceremony Takes Place At Camp Church

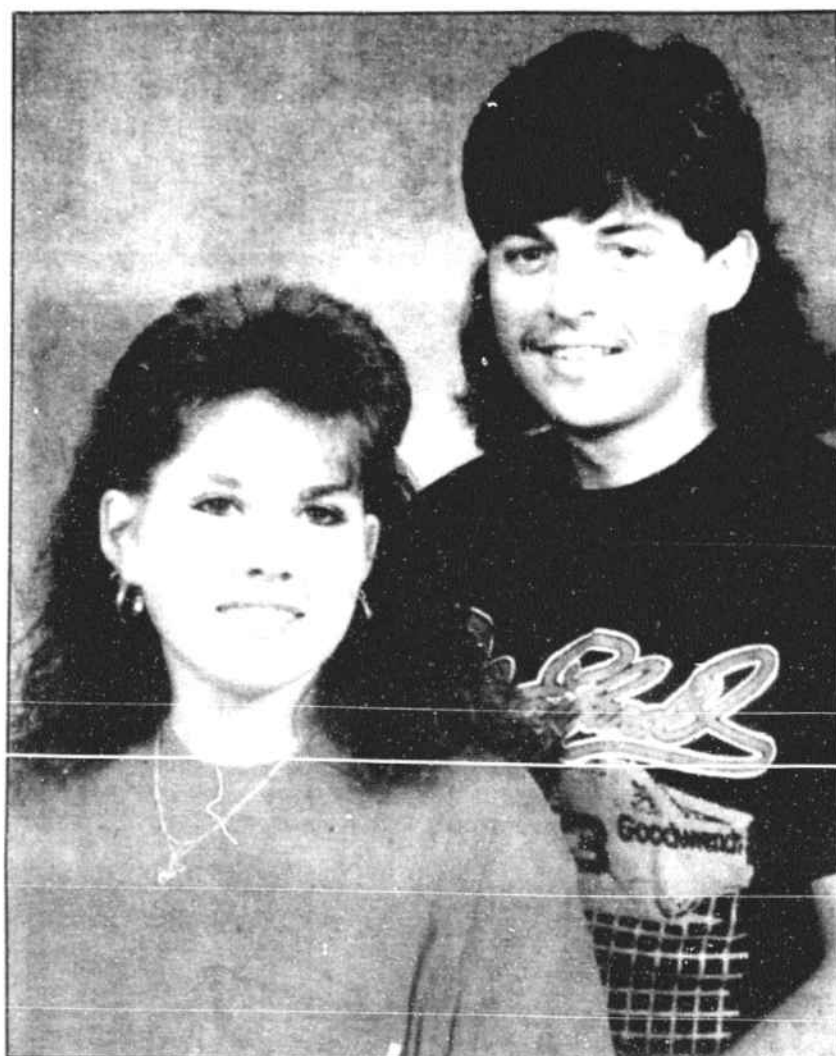
The wedding was directed by Linda Varnum of Supply.

Brunswick County Schools Staff Working On Anti-Violence Programs

Brunswick County schools are implementing a violence prevention grant awarded by the N.C. Department of Public Instruction, according to Linda Shaddix, Safe Alternatives project coordinator for the local schools system.

The grant's five objectives are:

- increasing school bus safety by installing video cameras on all Brunswick County school buses;
- teaching conflict resolution and developing peer mediation programs in all schools. Six staffers from schools went to a "training of trainers" to teach the program;
- providing parent education to support efforts at helping their children. Seven staff attended training to teach the parent education and support program in all schools;
- providing "multicultural education and sensitivity programs" in all schools. Staff has developed a program and collected materials for the schools to implement;

■ implementing an alternative to out-of-school suspension pilot program at North Brunswick High School in which parents may choose not to have a student stay at home during suspension. Dupont will be the first site where students will have supervision, work, tutoring, counseling and mentors from Dupont and the school staff.

Six staff members also attended a crisis prevention training to learn to teach others how to defuse volatile situations before they erupt and how to safely manage situations if violence occurs.

Shaddix said, "The effort of the grant was to purchase materials and

to organize and train trainers to prepare as many staff as possible with techniques and programs to teach students ways to handle conflict in a safe and successful way so that all students and teachers have the safest environment possible to teach and learn."
