Summer Ventures is a four-week enrichment program for rising junior and senior high school students with talent and interest in science and mathematics. The program is the largest cost-free one of its kind in the country.

It is offered on six campuses of the University of North Carolina and is administered by the N.C. School of Science and Mathematics. Summer Ventures students live on the campuses of the host institutions and participate in research-oriented courses designed and taught by university faculty and public school teachers.

Students are required to conduct a research project and to report the results of their work at the end of the program. About 700 students attend Summer Ventures in Science and Mathematics each year and are selected from an applicant pool of more than 1,700.
