The 1994-95 school year began this week, and the West Brunswick faculty and students are excited about the various changes and new programs at the school.

However, before the year gets under way, the faculty and administrators would like to congratulate those juniors and seniors who received three hours of college credit by taking advanced placement exams in English, calculus and European history this spring.

At West, 40 AP exams were administered to 34 students. Twenty-five students re-

Students enrolled in advanced placement courses during this school year will have an opportunity to receive college credit by tak-

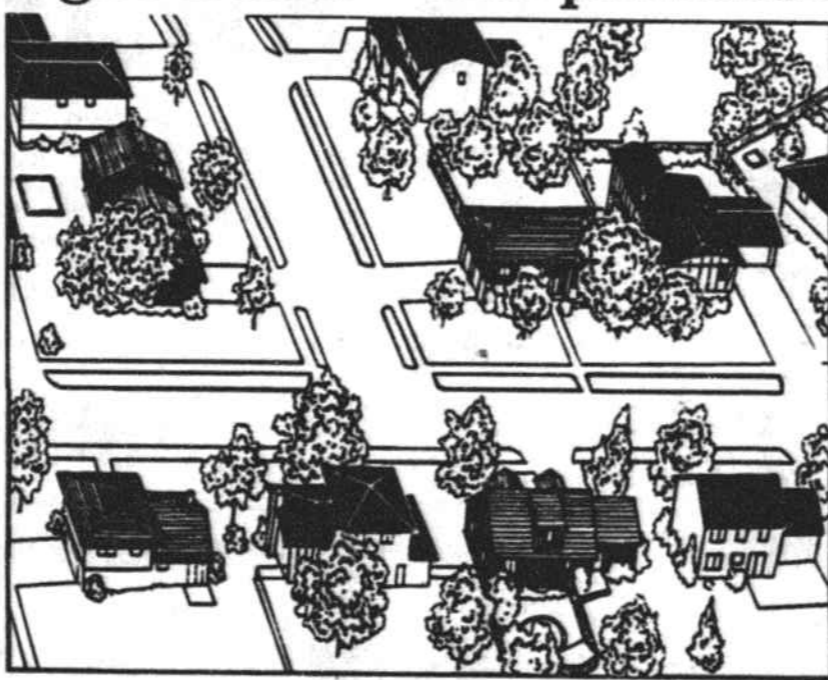
