

Ray Washam Wins Sea Trail Men's Championship

Ray Washam posted a 72-hole total of 314 to win the championship division in the Sea Trail Men's Golf Association Championships.

Eighty golfers entered the tournament, which started with qualifying rounds on Sept. 6 and concluded Sept. 16 with final rounds.

Runners-up in the championship division were Roger Long with gross 315, Sid Roberson with 316, Jim Trotter with 317, George Lefelar and Jim Jones with 319, Jack Cain with 320 and George Beerman with 322.

One round of medal play and three rounds of match play were used in the four handicap flights and Golden Flight.
