Be Cautious Of Sound-Alike Solicitors, Says Heart Association

Be cautious when responding to mail requests for donations from nonprofit organizations, warns Susan Gibble, local contact for the American Heart Association.

Mailings from organizations with similar-sounding names may confuse the donor and divert funds away from intended agencies.


"In particular we are concerned that the public may confuse the American Heart Association with other groups whose names include words like 'American,' 'national,' 'heart,' 'heart disease,' 'heart research,' 'heart support,' 'cardiac,'

'cardiovascular' and so on," Gibble said.

Judy Howard, area director for the Region 8 office of the American Heart Association, said the local office and other AHA offices across the state have received numerous requests for information about sound-alike and look-alike organizations.

"While the AHA does not wish to question any legitimate not-for-profit agency raising funds for cardiovascular research, we do want the public to understand that there is no relationship between these sound-alike groups and the American Heart Association."
