DONORS RECEIVE FREE TICKETS BCC Auditorium Invites Support Of Benefactors

A patron, who contributes \$200 to \$499, receives two tickets, program listing, advance notification, a tax-deductible donation of at least \$60, and an invitation to the 1995-96 subscription season kick-off reception.

For a gift of \$500 to \$1,499, an angel receives four tickets to each performance, program listing and other benefits mentioned, and a tax-deductible donation of at \$220.

Archangels, whose contributions are \$1,500 and up, receive the above benefits, but with a tax-deductible donation of at least \$1,220.

A special incentive is available for business

sponsors that contribute \$1,000 and up. The name of the business appears in each program as a business sponsor, the business receives 10 tickets to each subscription performance, and a tax-deductible donation of at least \$300.

The amount of tax-deductible donations is calculated by subtracting the actual ticket price from the total gift. Season tickets are \$70 adults, and \$60 for seniors, students and children.
