Mustangs Maul Scorpions 40-0

North Brunswick High School's football season came to a merciful close Friday night with a 40-0 loss to South Robeson.

It was the third straight shutout loss for Coach Garry Bishop's Scorpions, who finished 1-6 in the Three Rivers Conference and 3-7

South Robeson, which posted its sixth shutout win of the year, improved their record to 5-2 in the league and 8-2 overall. The Mustangs gave up just 37 points during the regular season.

The 40-0 loss ended a North Brunswick season that had started with such promise. The Scorpions won three of their first four games but lost their last six by a combined margin of 199-13.

North Brunswick, like conference foes East Bladen, Fairmont and Red Springs, did not qualify for the state playoffs that open Friday night.

St. Pauls, which tied with East

East Bladen 40, Fairmont 0 for the conference championship, will open the state 2A playoffs at home Friday against South

The Bulldogs received the conference's only berth in the state 2A playoff by virtue of their 44-27 win over East Bladen during the regular

St. Pauls (6-1, 9-1) has won its last six games, while Waccamaw Conference member South Columbus (4-2, 7-3) carries a four-game winning streak into the playoffs.

Bladenboro (5-2, 7-3) edged out South Robeson (5-2, 8-2) for the Three Rivers Conference's top seed in the state 1A playoffs. The league received three spots in the western bracket.

Bladenboro will open at home Friday against Jordan-Matthews (5-5), the third-place team out of the Central Tar Heel Conference.

South Robeson, which advanced to the state semifinals last year, plays its first-round playoff game on the road against Central Tar Heel
