St. Pauls, Tar Heel, Bladenboro Advance

Three of the four Three Rivers Conference teams that qualified for the state high school football playoffs advanced to the second round with wins last Friday night.

Conference co-champion St. Pauls moved on to round two of the state 2A playoffs, while Bladenboro and Tar Heel each advanced in the 1A bracket. South Robeson, a state 1A semifinalist last year, lost its playoff opener.

In first-round action, St. Pauls defeated visiting South Columbus 22-6 Friday night. The Bulldogs (10-1) will play their second-round game this week at Western Guilford (10-1).

In the 1A ranks, Bladenboro thrashed visiting Jordan-Matthews 46-6 while Tar Heel was a 24-22 winner at East Montgomery.

Bladenboro (8-3) will host Tar Heel (4-7) this week in second-round playoff action. The Bulldogs crushed the Panthers 31-6 in their regular-season meeting Sept. 23.

South Robeson, a state semifinalist in 1993, lost its first round game at North Moore 14-13. The Must-
