Hope Memorial Baptist Church at floor-length mauve satin dress, designed by her mother, with ribbon roses around the neckline.


Richard Causey served as his son's best man. The groom wore a formal black tuxedo with tails, a bolo tie and black cowboy hat and

Set in Nuremberg in the Biedermeier era, it recounts the adventures of a young girl, Clara, and her toy nutcracker, which comes magically to life as Clara dreams and sleeps on Christmas Eve.

Clara and the Nutcracker battle and conquer giant mice, led by the evil Mouse King. After winning the battle, they journey through the woods in a storm of dancing snowflakes to the Land of Sweets, ruled by the Sugar Plum Fairy. There Clara and the Nutcracker are treated to dances by all of the confections.
