**Negro Missionary
At Winfall School**

**Speaks to Colored Stu-
dents at Perquimans
Training School**

Dr. Boone, a Negro missionary to Africa, who is spending sometime in the United States, was at Winfall this week and gave an interesting program at the Perquimans Training School, the Negro school.

There are 305 students enrolled at this school, which under the direction of Prof. K. A. Williams, an outstanding member of his race, is doing fine work.
