SMALL ENGINES TO FARMERS Distribution of about 37,000 air and liquid-cooled internal combustion engines of 20-horsepower and under will be controlled by County Farm Rationing Committees. Preference rating certificates will be issued to farmers or operators of farm machinery for hire, based on the need for the engine in essential production of crops, livestock and livestock products, poultry and eggs, and bees. When the farmer receives such a preference rating certificate, he can take it to his local dealer and buy the engine.
