**SOIL CONSERVATION NOTES**

John T. Lane, E. M. Perry, John Q. Hurdle, Dr. T. P. Brinn, Jack Brinn, Nixon Hollowell, Ned Nixon and Frank Skinner attended a field tour on drainage held near Hickory, Virginia, September 18th.

One of the main drainage practices getting under way in that section is the construction of sloped ditches. The reeds, large bushes and stumps were being removed and old field ditches sloped out, all of which was being done with mechanical equipment. The cost on ordinary size field ditches was approximately 10 to 15 cents per linear yard.

A drag line was being used on a large lead ditch on one farm. The dirt was being spread with a large bulldozer. We did not learn how much the lead ditch was costing per yard since the machinery was being rented on an hourly basis. The drag line was a one cubic yard size and rented for \$10.00 per hour.

The main advantage of the sloped field ditches are: No bushes and reeds to shrub each year and the low cost of maintaining them. Some of these ditches which were constructed two years ago were cleaned out with mechanical equipment this year at a

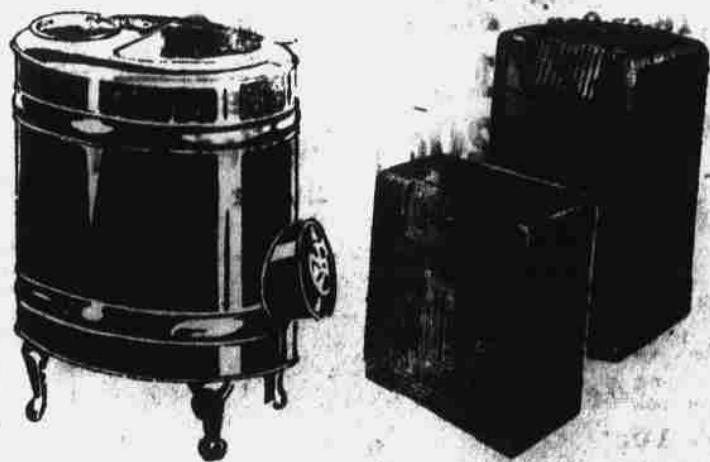
