### Clean-up Makes Farms Safer, More Efficient

A good spring clean-up not only increases farm efficiency but also eliminates hazards which might cause injury to animals on people, according to County Agent C. W. Overman, county agent for the State College Extension Service.

Stressing that spring is a good time for cleaning up barns and yards, Mr. Overman said that a few hours spent now may result in the saving of many days during the busy season

A recent Council tudy of hospitalized home accident es showed that the largest single se of injuries, other than poor gement, was disorder. In fact, isorder was responsible for putting e out of every five accident victims in the hospital.

Mr. Overman said that every farm family should remove accumulated papers, rags and rubbish in the home from basement to attic; see that medicines, drugs and insecticides are clearly labeled and kept out of the reach of children; and provide suitable receptacles for knives and other tharp kitchen tools.

Barns are the principal work cent-er for daily farm chores, he continu-ed. At this season of the year many barns have become cluttered with the accumulation of items used during the winter. It is important to find suitable locations or storage places for feed, tools, harness and other equipment to keep alleyways and work areas clear, the county
