Two important deadlines for North Carolina Veterans are at hand, Mr. Stephen H. Alford, District Officer of the North Carolina Veterans Commission warned today.

The first affects those veterans who have service-connected disabili-ties of 50 per cent. They have until December 1 to submit evidence of relationship and dependency to qualify for dependency allowances effective on that date. Formerly this benefit was restricted to those with 60% disabilities.

Veterans who can qualify for this benefit should not assume that their records with the federal government are complete in this respect. An assumption of this kind, in error, could mean that payments would not be-come effective until date evidence was received. Once Veterans Administration has information that veterans are claiming dependents such vet-erans have five months to prove such

relationships.

The second deadline affects veterans with service-connected disabilities who permitted their National Service Life Insurance to lapse. Veterans have until December 31 to reinstate their insurance without having service- connected disabilities counted against them.

Veterans can obtain application forms from the District Office of the Veterans Commission, 206 Kramer Building, Elizabeth City, North Carolina or from C. C. Banks, Hertford, North Carolina, County Service Officer, who have been advised of these important deadlines and are ready to assist veterans in meeting them.
