Average Soldier Costs Army \$5,200 Per Year

WASHINGTON-It costs the Army and the taxpayer approximately \$11,000 to train, equip and maintain a soldier for a two-year period.

The first year's cost to induct, transport equip, train, feed and clothe a new soldier and his pay and allowances is \$5,800. Each year thereafter costs \$5,200 per enlisted man.

These are average world-wide cost figures for enlisted men. They are based on per capita costs or costs of major equipment and construction.

Farm Fires Increase: Precautions Urged

Farm fire losses, which last year reached \$133,000,000, are expected to be even higher this year, close to \$140,000,000, U. S. Department of Agriculture reports. Their major causes, according to the National Board of Fire Underwriters, were carelessnes and faulty building construction.


