SPLIT PEA SOUP
2 cups dried split peas or lentils
1 quart water
1 ham bone (about 1 pound)
1 large onion
1 to 4 celery tops
1 carrot, sliced
1 teaspoon salt
¼ teaspoon pepper
Combine all ingredients. Simmer 3 hours. Stir occasionally. Remove bone. Put vegetables and broth through a sieve. Put soy bits of ham, lentil pieces and put back in soup. Cook for additional 15 minutes if necessary. Make 2½ quarts. This is excellent reheated.
