**Buy Easter Seals**

The National Society for Crippled Children and Adults, Incorporated, is sponsoring another Easter Seal campaign. The Society is asking millions of Americans to support programs designated to provide care and treatment, education and research to benefit crippled citizens.

Last year the Society treated more than 100,000 crippled children and adults and it is hoping to expand its services to reach an even greater number this year.

The 1954 campaign closes April 18. By that time, more than 1,200 Easter Seal affiliates in each of the forty-eight states and abroad hope to have concluded a successful Easter Seal campaign.

In past years the Easter Seal campaign, in behalf of crippled children and adults has appealed to most Americans. This is only natural, and the citizens of this community should once again purchase Easter Seals. While there are a number of charitable drives at this time of year, they have not been so numerous that the more fortunate of us cannot spare a few dollars for the benefit of those not so fortunate, and not fortunate enough to be able to take proper steps to remedy their condition.

**Returning German Private Property**

Chancellor Konrad Adenauer of West Germany has appealed to the United States Government to return property held by this Government seized during World War II from its German owners. The Chancellor has a forceful argument in asking for a return since he is only asking for action consistent with what this Government has already accorded Italy—the other major European enemy during World War II.

Recently the Dirksen committee, of which Republican Senator Everette Dirksen of Illinois is chairman, made a report on the question of seized German property and recommended it be returned to its former German owners. Since 1948, when Congress enacted a War Claims Law, German and Japanese assets which had been seized have been in charge of the Alien Property Office and the proceeds of sales have been used to sat-

isfy claims of those who suffered at the hands of the Germans and Japanese.

The value of the property seized from the Germans is said to amount to some \$500,000,000. Some of the assets seized have already been sold and the proceeds used to satisfy claims, but much of it is still in the hands of the Alien Property Office. Adenauer points out that those Germans who owned property, or businesses, in the United States were the very ones who sought to promote friendship between Germany and the United States in most cases.

We are in accord with the Dirksen committee report and hope that Congress will see fit to restore the property of German citizens seized in World War II. This is the normal action and, although many German owners may be guilty of anti-democratic actions and beliefs in the past, there is no successful way for the United States to determine the degree of guilt of these tens of thousands of individuals. Moreover, the Germans deserve the same treatment as was accorded the Italians, and the return of this property will certainly improve relations between West Germany and the United States.
