He left hanging the question whether there was any limit to these fantastic new bombs.

So terrible has the destructiveness of atomic weapons become even the Russians appear to be ready to join in ban against their use. It begins to look more and more like that the next war—if there is one—will be fought in the conventional manner, without the use of atomic weapons.

Move To Curb Armaments

The United States, Great Britain and France recently asked the United Nations Disarmament Commission to meet on the question of disarmament and atomic energy control. The three Western democracies asked that the United Nations Disarmament Commission set up a sub-committee composed of the chief atomic powers.

This sub-committee would meet in secret session, in an effort to come to some decision on the entire field of disarmament, including small guns and weapons up to the size of hydrogen bombs.

Informed of the move by Sir Pierson Dixon, of Great Britain, Russia's Andrei Vishinsky said he welcomed the round of talks.

There are growing indications that the entire world, both Communist and the free, is slowly coming to the conclusion that the use of hydrogen weapons will accomplish nothing.

This is obvious because the use of such weapons would bring about instant retaliation with the same caliber weapons, and the net result would be one of almost unbelievable destruction in both East and West. If for no other reason this growing realization (emphasized by recent hydrogen bomb tests in the Pacific) gives a slight hope for success in the atomic weapons field. There is still little likelihood that any effective agreement will be reached on conventional armament.

Strauss Meets The Press

Rear Admiral Lewis L. Strauss, chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission, was recently exposed to reporters from every section of the country by President Dwight D. Eisenhower. The President took the occasion of a presidential press conference to bring along the AEC chairman and, after the President had answered reporters' questions, he stepped aside for the Admiral.

Reporters had been asking President Eisenhower to have Strauss hold a press conference and give them details on the hydrogen bomb for some weeks. As soon as the opportunity arose—the opportunity having been arranged by the President—reporters were fast to fire questions at the AEC
