The next restaurant labeled "Chicken Basket" and then Florence, S. C., at 3:10. Pee Dee River 3:30. Nine farms and collard patches in this area. Mullens 4 o'clock. We cross the State line and enter North Carolina at 4:20 . . . a beautiful view, again!
