**Hurricanes Still A Mystery**

Hurricane Carol, which recently struck New England and toppled the Old North Church in Boston, in addition to sweeping away hundreds of homes along the coast in that area, is still something of a mystery. Weather experts went to work on causes and reasons for the storm's sudden change in course immediately after it struck in the East.

But it is readily admitted that even the nation's top weather experts do not understand why hurricanes follow the various courses they unexpectedly take. In spite of the generally accepted belief that man knows most of what there is to know about the weather, weather bureau officials in the New York area recently admitted there are too many unknowns in the hurricane picture for them to accurately predict the path of hurricanes as yet.

Each storm brings with it new clues, and provides a new source of material for weather experts to study, and the experts have been huddling on the cause of the recent change of course of the recent hurricane. The most generally accepted theory, of course, is that low pressure areas draw in turbulent weather and cause storms, but exactly what causes low pressure areas is not fully understood and just why a low pressure area developed west of New York and drew Hurricane Carol north instead of northeast at the critical moment is yet not fully explained.

Another puzzle about hurricanes which is not yet fully understood is the question about high tides caused by them. It was formerly believed that hurricane tides resulted from lowered pressure at the center of an advancing storm. The lower pressure would cause water to rise since the pressure would not be as great.

In a new authoritative work on weather, by the American Meteorological Society, it is suggested that the pressure effect could only amount to about four feet. Yet hurricane tidal waves are quite often much higher than this and this suggests there is another cause—as yet unknown.

All of which brings us around to the point that man is still a long way from solving the secrets of nature, and especially those concerning the weather.

**The Latest From Bonn**

The reaction of the West German Government to the refusal of the French National Assembly to ratify the European Defense Community treaty has taken the expected course. Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's government has announced the new foreign policy of West Germany would be one seeking complete sovereignty, the right to rearm, and agreements with the United States and Great Britain, which would allow such rearmament.

In other words, the Bonn Government is more or less by-passing Paris in what amounts to a reorientation of German policy after two years of fruitless waiting for Paris to recognize the Communist danger as transcendent over the danger of new German aggression.

West Germany has little hope—no doubt—that France will agree to rearmament, but since the United States and British zones constitute most of West Germany, if the United States and Britain allow rearmament in these zones the West Germans could largely carry out their program without French approval.

It would appear that the United States and Great Britain would be justified in agreeing to German sovereignty and rearmament in the British and American zones. If the French do not wish to go along, they can attempt to maintain their zone as it is now being operated, but such a policy would surely cause tension between Germany and France as the years pass. No doubt in time the French would see their own mistake and conform to the wiser policies of Great Britain and the United States.

There is no question but that the Bonn Government is making a major play for a reoriented American and British foreign policy, and that this policy has chances for success. If it succeeds West Germany might become the principal U. S.-British ally in Europe, replacing France—whose governments seem incapable of maintaining a stable, far-sighted foreign policy over any period of years.
