

Since ours is a monetary, rather than a barter economy, our government and banking institutions must provide an adequate supply of money. As our economy grows, naturally our money supply should grow approximately the same proportion to handle the increase in the volume of transactions.

Good Results Obtained From Christmas Trees

The growing of Christmas trees has meant a happier Christmas for many 4-H'ers, according to Jim Anderson, extension forestry specialist.

He says Christmas tree plantations have been started by many 4-H Club members in the past with excellent results. Cedars costing \$3.50 per thousand when planted have brought a dollar each or higher when harvested.

A. T. Griffin Manufacturing Co., of Goldsboro, in cooperation with the Wayne County extension agents is contributing to the 4-H forestry program in Eastern North Carolina by making available the land, labor, and fertilizer for experimental work in growing cedars for Christmas trees.

Anderson says that 21 test plots were established on the Griffin Riverwood property where various combinations of fertilizer were tried to determine what practice will be best to speed the growth of cedars. The effects of fertilizer on color and quality will also be determined.

He points out that rich sites can produce saleable trees in half the time needed on poor sites. As a rule, however, only the poorer sites are available for growing trees. It is in the hope of seeding growth on these sub-normal sites that the Griffin Company sponsored the experiment.

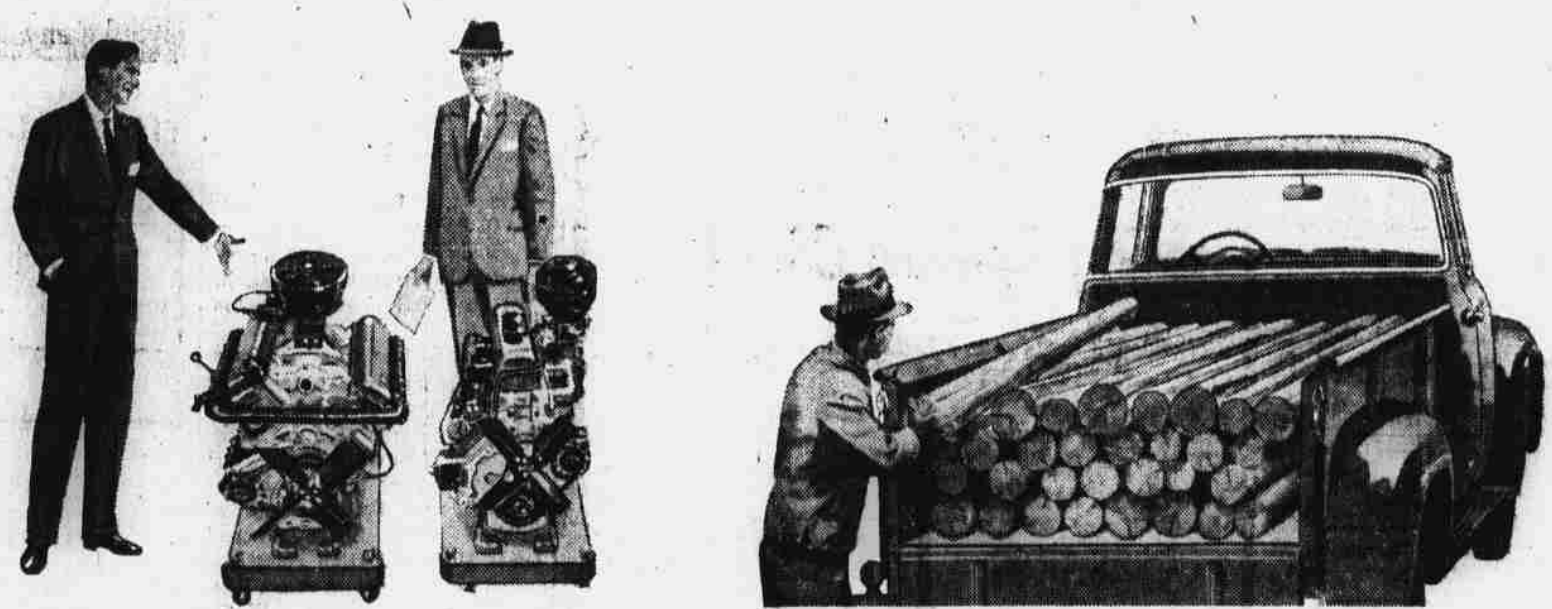
