BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$125,000 SCHOOL BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF PERQUIMANS

WHEREAS, the County Board of Education of the County of Perquimans has determined that existing school plant facilities in the Perquimans County School Administrative Unit are not adequate for the maintenance of public schools for the nine months' school term prescribed by law, and has requested the Board of Commissioners to provide the sum of \$125,000 to fi-nance the additional school plant facilities which are described in Section 1 of this bond order and which said County Board of Education has determined are neces sary to enable the County of Perquimans, as an administrative agency of the public school system of the State of North Carolina to maintain public schools in said Perquimans County School Administrative Unit for the nine months' school term prescribed by law: NOW, THEREFORE,
