

Peanut Allotment Causing Confusion Among Growers

There has been much confusion and misunderstanding with respect to the announced increase in 1956 peanut acreage allotment, announced by Joe S. Sugg, Executive Secretary of the North Carolina Peanut Growers Association. Mr. Sugg pointed out that the announcement appearing on February 21st, which announced a 13.7% increase in the acreage allotment for Virginia type peanut was misleading, inasmuch as this figure has no direct bearing upon the increase which an individual peanut producer in North Carolina will receive. It is hoped, Mr. Sugg says, that any person starting to read this article will read it carefully in its entirety in order that further misunderstanding will not accrue. Mr. Sugg pointed out that the increase awarded is 22,845 acres for the State of North Carolina, to be divided among the growers of the Virginia Type peanut, based on their average, within allotment, production of Virginia type peanuts for the years 1953, 1954 and 1955. He stated that the increase was given to the producers of Virginia type peanuts, based on Section 358-C-2 of the Agricultural Adjustment Act which authorizes the Secretary to increase the allotted acreage of any type of peanuts found to be in short supply by a sufficient quantity to satisfy the needs of the customers of that particular type of peanut. According to Sugg, the confusion which has arisen is over the fact that some producers in North Carolina have produced a portion, and in some cases all of their crop which classify as Runners, and that Runners are not being increased. The word Runner should not be confused with the type vine on which the peanuts are produced, but rather associated with the definition which states that peanuts which fall to grade 30% Fancy shall be classified as Runners, and those which grade in excess of 30% Fancy shall be classified Virginia type. He further pointed out that many farmers feel that the weather conditions caused their peanuts to grow small during 1955, which accounts for the fact that they had some of their crop grade Runner grade. This may be true, he stated; however, if any exception is made to take care of these individuals, then the exception would have to be made for the producers of the Southeast who normally produce approximately 50% of their crop in Runner peanuts and this would not be practical, inasmuch as there is a surplus supply of Runner peanuts in the market at this time.

Sugg pointed out that the indi-

vidual farmers should not attempt to compute their own acreage increase, inasmuch as the official announcement from the County ASC Offices may be expected within three weeks, which will mean each farmer should know his exact increase around the 15th of March, which will be ample time to make preparations for their plantings. He further suggests that the producers cooperate with the County ASC Offices and wait until their individual notices are received and not call upon the County Office for information pertaining to the allotments until after the receipt of notices. The County Offices cannot furnish any information prior to the completion of the computing of the increase.

The increase referred to is for the 1956 crop year only and will have no bearing on allotments for future years. Mr. Sugg stated that now is a good time for farmers to be careful of the type seed they plant in order that their crops will grade Virginia type and avoid any penalties in the future. North Carolina production in 1953 was 8% Runners, in 1954, 5% Runners and in 1955, 10% Runners, according to the summaries released by the Federal Grading Service.

Registration Books To Close March 10

Registration books for the special bond election to be held in Perquimans County Saturday, March 24 to determine the proposed issuance of \$125,000 in school bonds, were opened for the first time last Saturday and will remain open through Saturday, March 10, it was reported today by R. C. Murray, chairman of the Board of Elections. Individuals desiring to participate in this election, Mr. Murray said, must register by March 10. He added, however, persons already listed in the books need not register again in order to be eligible to vote. Registrars at the six polling places in the county reported very little activity in registering voters last Saturday, but state they know of a number of individuals who need to register before the books are closed a week from Saturday. Voters not sure of their eligibility to vote in this special election are advised to check with the registrars.

Seeking means whereby they might bring charges against him "to destroy him," the chief priests and the scribes, with the elders, came to him to question by what authority "doest thou those things? or who is he that gave thee this authority?" Jesus did not answer their questions directly for two reasons: First, because he knew they were not sincerely desirous of knowing the true answer—they only wanted to entrap him to accomplish their own ends; and second, they had already closed their minds as to the character and person of Christ. He knew they were determined to kill him and he felt under no obligation whatever to answer any question asked by lips from hearts set on murder. Rather, he asked them a question which, for them, was unanswerable. So, we see, that in the conversion of Zaccheus, it is He who seeks and saves the lost; in the parable of the pounds, it is He who distributes possessions and calls for an accounting; in his triumphal entry, it is He who is King; it is He who cleanses the Temple and in the subsequent argument, it is His authority that is questioned.
