Washington — The foremost statesman of the Congress, Senator Walter F. George of Georgia, announced last week that he would not seek reelection after the completion of his present Senate term.

The Realization

Seniority

Senator Carl Hayden of Arizona will become the senior member of the Senate in terms of service. He has been a member of Congress since Arizona was admitted to the Union. Before becoming a Congressman, he was high sheriff of a county in what was to become Arizona. He was elected to the Senate in 1927 after having served from 1912 until that time in the House. Senator Hayden, alert and possessing a keen mind, is Chairman of the Appropriations Committee. No man in Congress is better informed on appropriation matters than Senator Hayden.

General LeMay

General LeMay's testimony before our Special Air Force Subcommittee and the subsequent divergent views expressed by high Administration sources have touched off a national debate on the status and requirements of air power. This, to a certain degree, was one purpose of our special inquiry. We have shown the degree which our air progress has lagged, and General LeMay's testimony has shown that he feels strongly that the Russians are overtaking Uncle Sam in a hurry in air power. As I view it, the people should know the facts about the nation's air power with the exception of that information which must of necessity be kept classified in order not to assist a potential enemy. There has been more confusion than ought to be over what has been happening to our air defense, and I feel that the committee is rendering a useful service in probing to find out what the facts are.

Lapsed GI Insurance May Be Reinstated

Lapsed GI term insurance still may be reinstated before the end of the term period, the Veterans Administration said in answer to numerous inquiries.

VA said it has found that many veterans believe they no longer are entitled to GI insurance when they have missed several premium payments on 5-year term policies.

However, the agency explained, if the 5-year term has not expired, the policies may be reinstated with the payment of two monthly premiums.

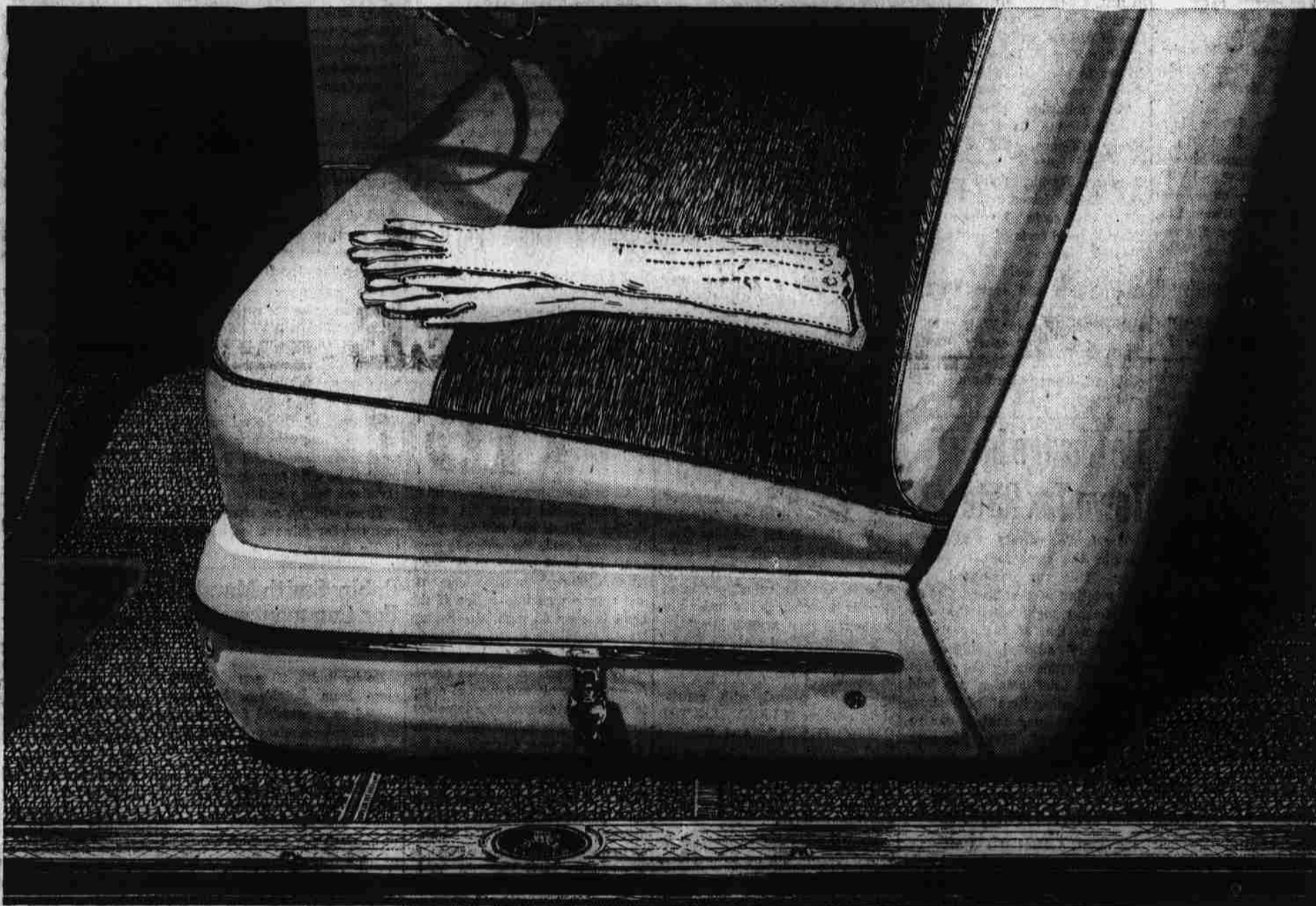
