

**Suburbs Now Have 27% Of U. S. Population**

The population gap between suburbs and cities narrowed further in the 1950-55 period, with the outlying parts of standard metropolitan areas growing seven times as fast as the central cities in the period, according to data compiled by the U. S. Bureau of the Census.

Despite this trend, however, the central cities of the metropolitan areas still contain the biggest single block of the U. S. population, amounting to just under a third of the total. This proportion has

changed little over the last decade and a half.

The population of the outlying areas of standard metropolitan areas gained about 9 1/2 million in population in the 1950-55 period to a total of more than 44 million inhabitants. The comparable figure in 1940 was less than 26 million. As a result, the suburbs now have 27 per cent of the total civilian population of the United States, the highest such proportion on record.

**Service Battle?**

Another Year—

Another Battle—

The lid is about to come off another signaling struggle in Washington being an election year. The House in Capitol Hill is making the most of it.

It is not solely a case of military versus policy, it is around a struggle over the control of certain weapons and services, it touches on the role of various services, also.

The Air Force is involved in the struggle and is the unfortunate recipient of being the youngest of getting the most money and getting up the most envy among top brass in the other two services.

The Army, under General Max Taylor, is taking on new theoretical function. The Navy, having the carrier battle some years ago is fighting for a major role in strategic warfare. The Navy is losing this battle.

The Army is having tougher goings on. The Air Force, for one thing, has the Army's much-touted ground-to-air defense missile program. High bombers, traveling in an often elude the NIKE, the Air Force believes, after a thorough study. Moreover, planes can be shot down and lost, and the Army is to be hit, and get away by remaining the NIKE's target.

The Army says it isn't so. The NIKE is the answer to enemy air attacks, says the Army, especially the new B. Congressmen on Capitol Hill now demanding a cut between the Air Force's two intercontinental missiles and the NIKE. In a rough comparison, in the form of an actual test, has been constructed.

The Air Force has two guided missiles on the order of a Navy missile, which can be controlled in flight. The NIKE cannot be controlled in flight. The Air Force has rejected the NIKE and says designer is himself suggesting the Army make a change in its defense program.

Generally, this stirs a hornet's nest among those who have billed the NIKE as great defense weapon. It certainly has been rejected by Members of Congress and hundreds of millions of Americans. If the Air Force is behind the Army is behind the Navy.

The case isn't settled yet. Eisenhower is an old hand. And although most Air Force officers are too, the Executive wants the Army to have a fair hearing. And he doesn't want to have a big row over weapons in an election year or any other time, for that matter.

Also entering into the happy picture at this time is a difference of opinion as to the Navy's capability to maintain a strategic bombing offensive with its huge carriers. How much the Navy can contribute in such a sustained offensive is a matter now being thrashed out between service brass and Congressmen, but there is a difference of opinion on this among Air Force and Navy officers.

In the end, President Eisenhower will have to set policy on the issue now so alive. Strategic bombing is an Air Force mission but the Navy will probably be encouraged to help all it can. And the Army will get its chance to prove the value of the NIKE. If the NIKE is not adequate under modern conditions, someone may be on the hot seat.

Senator Walter George holds the key to the Administration's hopes for a big foreign aid program this year. The retiring Georgia deal of the Senate has said in recent years he was voting for a large foreign aid bill for the last time. Now that he has accepted President Eisenhower's call to become special ambassador for the United States organization, Senator George might be more inclined to support a liberal foreign aid program.

Pressure from back home on Eisenhower against big foreign aid programs has increased in recent years, as the people in most parts seem to be tiring of these programs while U. S. taxes are high. In Georgia Senator George's probable successor, Herold, was ready to tear through on this issue.

Eisenhower has whacked more money off the program. Senators in the Senate are the

**SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON**

They try to go part of the way with both, and end up realizing that they have gone all the way with one—the wine has taken control. Paul reminded the Ephesians that they were now "children of the light" and that they should therefore "walk as children of light."

**Millionth Veteran Has Paid GI Loan**

The millionth veteran has repaid his GI loan in full, Veterans Administration has announced.

As of January 31, 1956, 1,024,919 loans for homes, farms, and businesses totaling more than \$5.1 billion had been repaid in full or nearly one out of every four GI loans guaranteed or insured by VA.

In the 11 years of the program, VA has underwritten 4,699,885 GI loans totaling \$34.4 billion. Most of the loans, or 4,306,515 were for homes. Of the remainder, 68,966 were farm loans and 224,214 were business loans.

Of the 1,024,919 GI loans repaid in full, 809,511 were home loans totaling \$4.6 billion; 42,277 were farm loans totaling \$132 million, and 173,131 were business loans totaling \$420 million.

In addition to the \$5.1 billion repaid in full, VA estimates another \$3.5 billion has been paid off in installments by veterans whose loans are still outstanding.

VA has paid claims to lenders on only 40,035 loans for homes, farms and businesses. These loans had an original principal amount of approximately \$200 million.

The net loss to VA has been only \$20 million.
