And other industries may be affected sooner. Economists disagree on the direction the economy is headed. There are indications cre dit restrictions will be soon eased and the soil bank program may be of some value to farmers this year. But the crux of the economic picture is to be farming and industrial developments in the next few

A good year is almost imperative for farmers if the farm economy is not to continue to exert a drag on expansion of the national economy. Developments between now and November will answer this question.

A pickup in the automotive and hard goods field, coupled with a farm incline, might make for an inflationary trend of very good business. It's true that farm income has become a relatively small part of the economy but it still is a major influence. Farm prices have started up, and if they continue in this direction, it will be highly significant.

New models are expected to pep up the automobile industry after the strike. With inventories building up, and consumer credit on the rise, the steel strike may not have too much of an adverse effect on the economy after all-if it is terminated within a reasonable time.

One of the little-known stories of U. S. foreign policy is the story of a U. S. blunder concerning Iceland, where we are now about to lose our big Air Force base, Keflavik.

Keklavik is on a direct route line to Moscow and is nearer Moscow than it is to New York. In fact, it is only about four hours, or less, from the Russian capital, as measured in speeds obtainable on today's bombers.

Russia moved in on the economic scene, in Iceland, four years ago and began to buy Iceland's fish, the major export. A dispute with Great Britain over fishing rights in various waters ended with Russia's stepping in and becoming Iceland's biggest customer.

The United States was also not unaware of what might happen. The State Department knew that it would be smart for this country to lower its import bars a bit on Iceland's fish, in the interest of beter international relations.

This country has already put many millions of dollars into the big Keflavik base, and it is one of the world's finest. But ever since Russia moved in on Iceland's economy to such an extent it has been only a matter of time until the Reds attempted to cause trouble, to run us out of that country.

They appear very near final success now. U. S. business interests refused to support proposals to al-low more fish from Iceland to be sold in this country. Yet we used to buy a major part of Iceland's exports-far more than the Communists. And that was as late as 1954! Today the percentage of Ice-


