PANCAKE STACKS WITH ORANGE SAUCE
1 pkg. pancake mix 1/2 teaspoon salt
1 to 2 cups cottage cheese 1 cup orange juice
1 egg 2 tablespoons granulated sugar
1/2 cup cornstarch 1/2 cup milk
1/4 cup sugar 1 orange, sectioned

Prepare pancake mix according to package directions or prepare your favorite recipe using orange juice in place of milk for liquid. Make 7 large pancakes. Stack pancakes, spreading 1/2 cup cottage cheese between each. Combine cornstarch, sugar and milk in a saucepan. Blend in orange juice gradually; add orange rind. Cook over medium heat until mixture comes to a boil, stirring constantly. Add orange sections. Spoon orange sauce over top of pancakes. Cut into wedges. Makes 4 to 6 servings.
