**SUPPORT PRICE ON SOYBEANS ANNOUNCED**

 a support price of \$2.07½ per bushel provided the beans do not contain more than 20 per cent splits and have a test weight of at least 54 pounds. A discount of ½

cent per bushel for each 5 per cent of splits in excess of 20 per cent is applicable. A discount of ¼ cent per bushel is applicable for each pound when the test weight is below 54 pounds.

Farm storage loans on soybeans can be obtained at the county ASC office. The beans must be stored in an approved bin or barn on the farm. A service fee of 1 cent per bushel must be paid on farm storage loans.

Farmers desiring additional information about the soybean price support program should contact the county ASC office.
