An ordinance regulating the parking or rental of land to be used for parking House Trailers or Trailers used as living quarters in the corporate limits of the Town of Hertford, N. C.  
1. Definitions:  
(a) House Trailer. Any trailer used as a home, or as living quarters.  
(b) Lot of land. Any space used or rented or owned, for the

purpose of parking a house trailer.  
2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park any house trailer in the corporate limits of the Town of Hertford, N. C., unless such trailer is parked at least six (6) feet from the property line of such lot, and at least ten (10) feet from any other building.  
3. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park any house trailer in the corporate limits of the Town of Hertford, N. C., unless such trailer is connected with the Town water and sewer system.  
4. Each day that this ordinance is violated, shall be a separate offense.  
5. Any person, firm or corporation violating this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction, shall be punished by a sentence of not more than thirty (30) days in jail, or be a fine of not more than \$50.00, or both, at the discretion of the court.
