Naval officials stated the low bid was well under the estimated costs. The contract for the project is expected to be awarded within the next few days and work on the building will get under way shortly after the letting of the contract.

Ralph Hall, Chief Inspector at Harvey Point NAS, advised this reporter this week work at the base is progressing according to schedule and the tempo of activity is expected to increase Weds J. A. Colvin within the next few weeks. within the next few weeks.

Plans to receive bids this week for construction of a boat house and operations building at the site were held up due to some changes made in the construction plans but bids for this project will be called for shortly. A contract for about \$2 million for installation of streets and utilities is scheduled to be let during the next 60 days. Total amount of contracts expected to be awarded during the month of May is \$4,721,000.
