North Carolina farmers should not increase their hog flocks at

J. R. Woodard, animal husbandry specialist for the N. C. Agri cultural Extension Service, says that despite the fact that hog pric-

es are around twice the 1955 of \$11 per hundred, farmers should expand cautiously.

He advises farmers to continue to strive to produce higher quality, meat-type hogs that will help increase the consumption of pork. This will help keep the market price of hogs high.

As he puts it, "We do not want and children of Limestone, Maine \$11 hogs again. A quality product will help prevent this.'

Woodard also urges farmers to push their spring pigs and try to market them by August 15. Prices usually hit their peak in July and early August.


