The annual dues are only \$5.00 per family which includes subscriptions to the Nation's Agriculture and the North Carolina Farm Bureau News, both monthly publications.

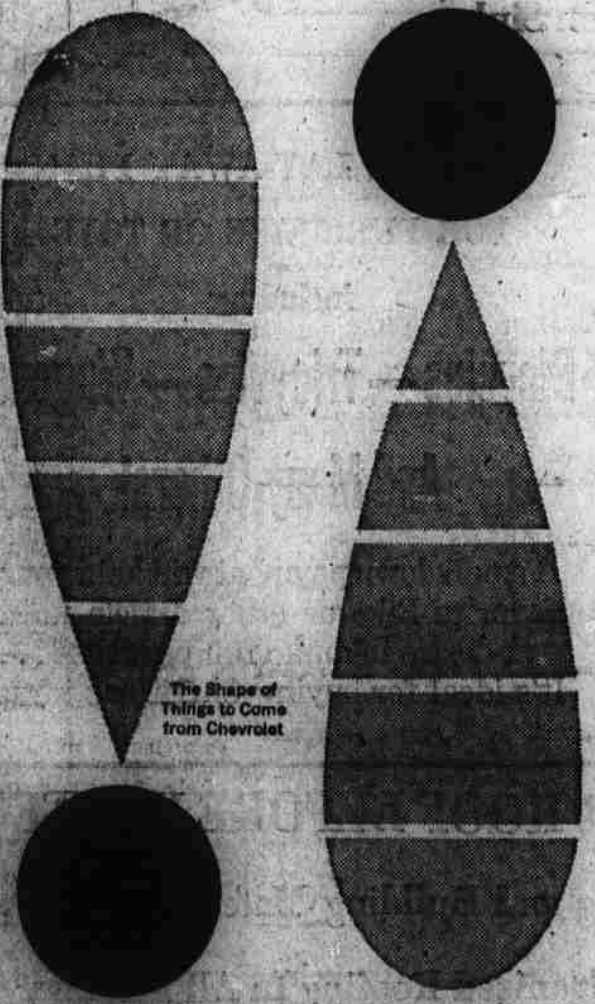
