

Big Armed Forces Celebration Planned At Virginia Beach

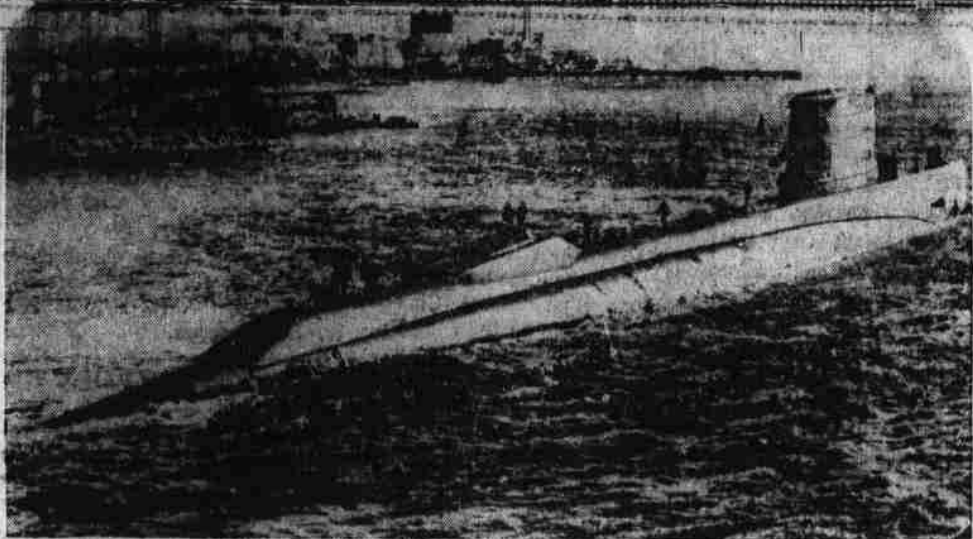
Approximately 100,000 persons are expected to witness the largest parade to be held in the history of the Tidewater area on Saturday, May 21st, when members of various military installations in the area, as well as civic organizations from the east coast of the state, march down Atlantic Avenue in Virginia Beach.

Occasion for the parade is part of the eleventh annual Armed Forces Week celebrations.

The parade, which will last for more than two hours, will be comprised of military and civilian marching units, bands, drum and bugle corps teams, floats, static displays of missiles, rockets, ordnance equipment, tanks and rescue equipment used at the Oceana Naval Air Station, drill teams, and fire-fighting equipment.

Starting at 10th and Atlantic Avenue, at 10:00 A. M., the parade will proceed down Atlantic Avenue to 31st Street.

The public is invited to attend the parade and open house at Oceana Naval Air Station.

Over One Million Cases Of N. C. Eggs Sold Out Of State In 1959

North Carolina egg producers reached another milestone in 1959. For the first time, they produced 1,000,000 more cases of eggs than were consumed in the state.

Total egg production in 1959 was 5,480,556 cases. Tar Heel consumption was 4,447,800 cases. "The situation has completely reversed itself since 1935," says Bill Jasper, poultry and egg marketing specialist for the N. C. Agricultural Extension Service.

"Back then, Tar Heels were consuming 1,000,000 more cases of eggs than they were producing," North Carolina was a deficit egg producing state until 1956. That year production moved ahead of consumption, and Tar Heel egg producers began looking out-of-state for markets for their surplus eggs.

The surplus egg supply totaled 166,000 cases in 1956. Progress has been steady ever since. By 1957, the surplus was up to 568,000. A year later it was 819,000, and in 1959 it reached 1,032,000 cases.

"We've been selling these surplus eggs out of state," says Jasper. "But we've had to compete with other surplus areas for markets."

Jasper expects North Carolina to continue increasing its egg production. "But," he warns, "market outlets in the future will be won by areas of production that offer the best at competitive prices. A growing egg income is dependent upon how well we maintain a constant high quality, high volume, and a dependable flow of eggs to our market outlets."

In fact, Jasper believes that high quality is the least cost form of advertising.

"Regardless of the amount of money spent on advertising our product, poor quality eggs will erase all the benefits we ever hope to gain from any promotional program," he says. "If we aren't willing to give markets the kind of eggs they want, somebody else will."
