

County Agent Urges Check For Wheat

If you are one of the farmers that have oats and wheat, now is the time to check for army worms as this is the time when they usually appear in the wheat and oat fields. If you notice unusual activity from birds in your small grain fields, you should check this field closely as this is a very good indication that these pests are present, states R. M. Thompson, County Agricultural Agent.

"If you decide that dusting is required," said Mr. Thompson, "I would suggest that you consider toxaphene and DDT mixed, as the results of this mixture have been better than either of the dusts separately.

"Past history has shown us," the agent stated, "that very few farmers that raise wheat and oats have been able to harvest a full crop without dusting for control of these insects, and it is pretty well agreed that this practice is necessary in the production of small grain.
