

# Farm Pond Safety Stressed During Farm Safety Week

Pick up a newspaper on a Monday morning in July. You will find one type of story almost as certainly as you'll find the weather forecast.

And part of that story will go something like this: "Bobby was swimming in a farm pond with three companions. They said he evidently got into water deeper than expected. Two of his companions tried to reach him. He almost carried them down, too. Members of the rescue squad found the body about an hour later."

Drownings similar to this occur with increasing frequency in North Carolina. The N. C. Rural Safety Council blames the increase on the increased number of farm ponds.

As one of their major efforts during National Farm Safety Week, July 24-30, the Safety Council is stressing the importance of farm pond and recreation safety.

"It is the responsibility of every farm pond owner to make his pond safe," the council says.

To help owners make their pond safe, the Rural Safety Council offers these suggestions:

- (1) Make certain that recreation is supervised at all times by an adult;
- (2) Post safety instruction for boating, swimming and skiing;
- (3) Mark safe swimming areas;
- (4) Place lifesaving devices such as ring buoys, ropes and long poles around swimming areas;
- (5) Know acceptable methods of artificial respiration;
- (6) Place a fence that can't be climbed around the pond so children can't play there without adult supervision; and
- (7) Clear all trees, stumps, brush, wire and rubbish from swimming and boating areas.

For users of the pond, the Council says never swim alone, fish alone, boat alone, ski alone or play around the pond alone. "Remember," the Council warned, "a boat is not a toy to be experimented with and played with by children."

Merchants in Perquimans County and the surrounding area have been invited to have commercial and educational booths.

The Home Demonstration County Council will sponsor the concession stand to be managed by Mrs. Colon Jackson, Mrs. J. E. Wood, Jr., and Mrs. Claude Winslow. Other club members will be assisting with the sale of homemade pies, cakes, ham, pimento cheese and chicken salad sandwiches and hot dogs.

An advance ticket sale for the fish fry supper from 5 to 9 is being conducted by civic clubs and Home Demonstration Clubs. Buy your ticket before August 3.

## KNOW YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY

John T. Grooms, representative of the Social Security Administration, is in Edenton every Thursday at the North Carolina Employment Security Commission office in the Citizens Bank Building.

When Bob Williams applied for his old age benefits in December 1957, he also asked about benefits for his thirteen year-old adopted son, George. George was an orphan. Bob had supported him for several years, and had adopted him the year before.

Bob was told at the social security office that the law required the adoption to be in effect three years before benefits could be payable for George. Since he had adopted George only one year before, Bob understood that there would be no payments for another two years.

One day about a year later, Bob read in a newspaper that there had been changes in the social security law, and that some of these changes concerned adopted children. Bob visited his social security office. He was told that, as of September 1958, an adopted child no longer had to wait three years to receive benefits, but could get them right away. He quickly filed an application for George, submitted his birth certificate and adoption papers, and pretty soon payments started to come through for George.

Bob and George benefited from one of the 1958 changes affecting adopted children. Another change provides that a child adopted by a person receiving disability payments may also qualify for benefits right after adoption, instead of having to wait three years.

Still another change applies to a child who was living with a working person and was being supported by him, although the child had not yet been adopted. If the wage earner dies, and the widow adopts the child within two years of her husband's death, benefits may be paid to the child and also to the widow as long as she has this minor child in her care. If the wage earner died several years ago, benefits may still be payable if the adoption is within two years of August 28, 1958, when the law was changed.
