

Employment Structure

Change with the economy is taking place in the income structure of the American working population according to data compiled by the U. S. Bureau of Economic Analysis.

The important development is the shift in the composition of the working population. The white collar group first caught up with the number of blue collar workers in the mid-Fifties, and has been widening the margin since.

This trend is particularly evident in the classification of professional, technical and kindred workers—the group that includes professional scientists and engineers, teachers, and the wide range of trained personnel needed to meet the technological requirements of a highly industrialized society, plus the challenge of the space age. The Census Bureau figures show that the professional occupations led all the other classifications in the 1951-58 period with a rise of 39 percent in employment and a jump of 104 percent in aggregate income.

On motion, the Board tabled the appointment of Welfare Board member until December 19, 1960 meeting.

On motion duly made, seconded and passed, the Board appointed the following Tax List Takers and Farm Crop Reporters for 1961: Mrs. Elton Layden, Belydree Township; T. Ordinance Regarding License Plates for Motor Vehicles Owned and Operated by the Residents of the Town of Hertford, North Carolina.

At a regular meeting of the Town of Hertford, held December 12, 1960, in the Town Office, Hertford, North Carolina, the following Commissioners and Mayor being present: Present, V. N. Darden, Mayor and Commissioners R. L. Hollowell, A. W. Hefren, H. C. Sullivan and R. A. White.

During this meeting the question of registration plates for the Town of Hertford, for all motor vehicle owners living in said Town, was duly discussed. After such discussion, the following ordinance was made and duly passed:

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation that own a motor vehicle, or vehicles to operate such motor vehicles in, on or about the streets of Hertford, North Carolina, without having displayed in a conspicuous place and manner, on such vehicles, a plate of such manner and form as is issued by the said Town of Hertford, North Carolina; this said plate must be placed on and carried on the outside of said motor vehicles.

The owner of any motor vehicle that is found being operated without a plate as herein above described, shall be guilty and upon conviction, shall be fined 30 days in jail, or not exceeding \$25.00 or both, in the discretion of the Court.

A copy of this ordinance shall be published in the next two weekly publications of the Perquimans Weekly, Hertford, N. C. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after the first day of January, 1961.

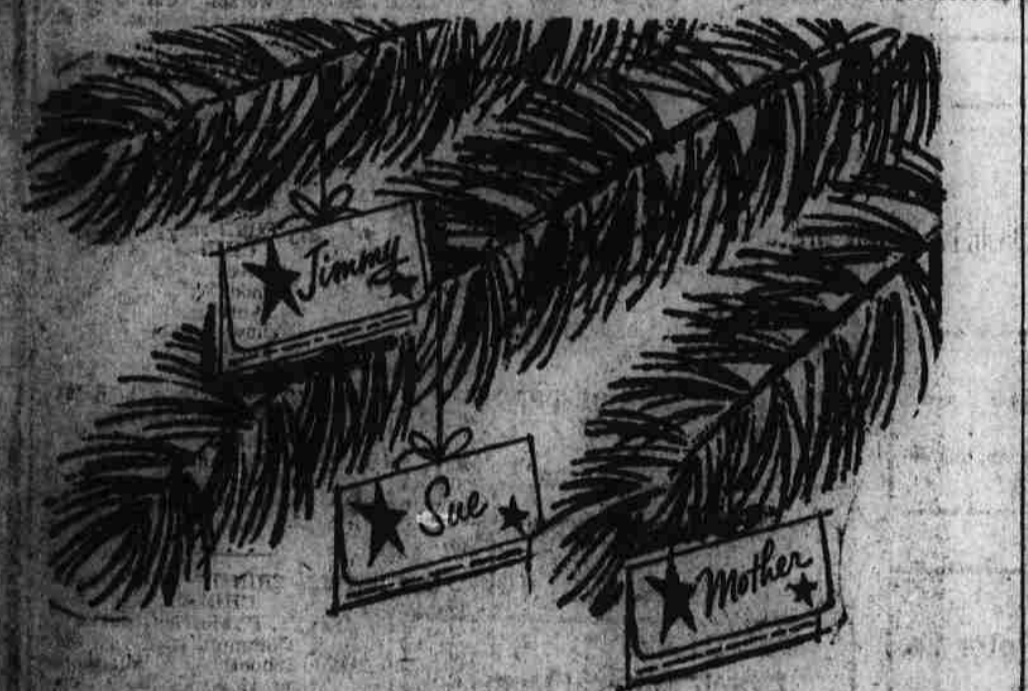

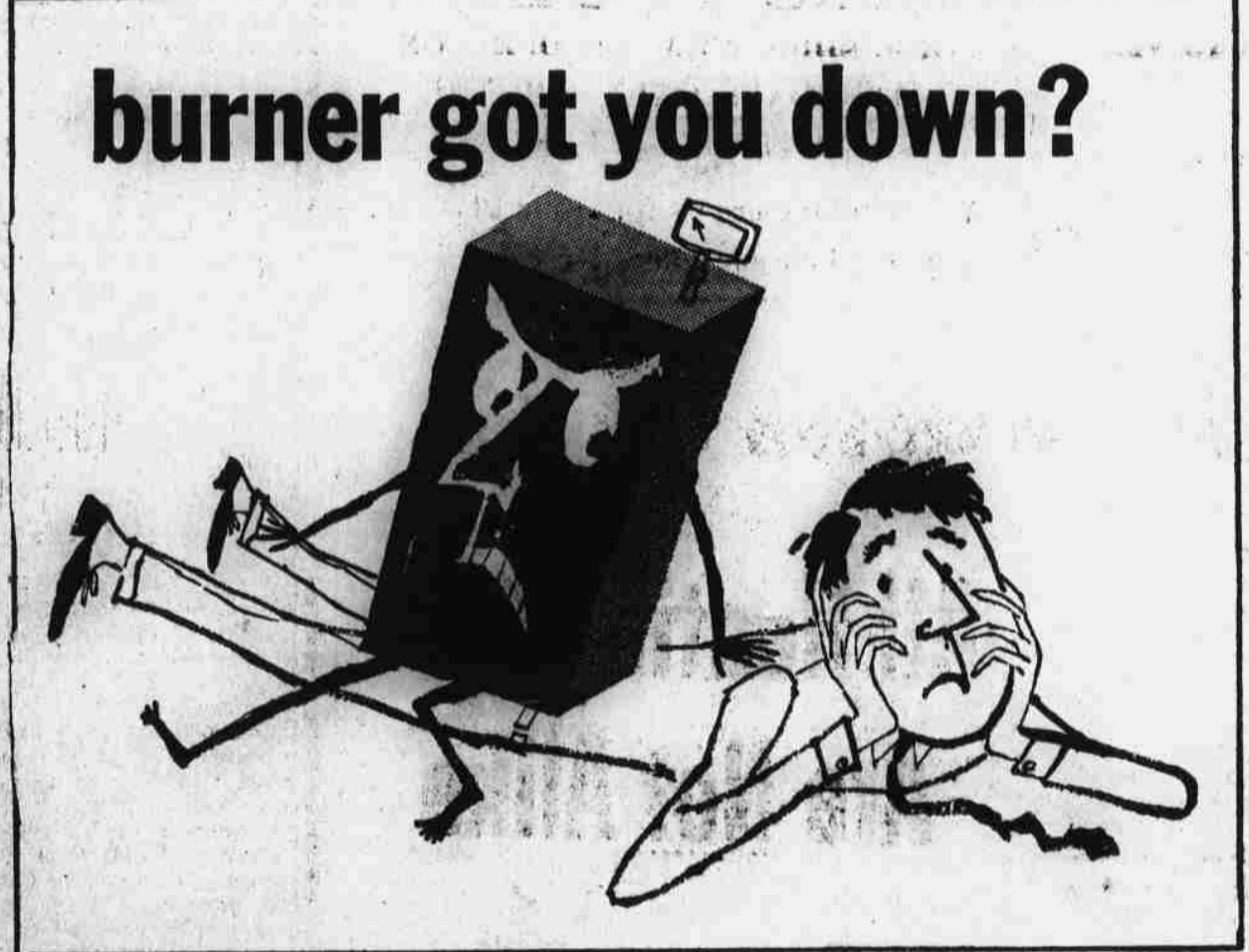
