

WIN YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY

The Norfolk Social Security office has some good advice for people who became eligible for social security benefits because of the 1960 social security amendments.

To speed the payment of your first retirement check, bring the necessary proofs with you the first time you come in to file a claim for benefits," John T. Grooms, Field Representative, said today.

Any social security office can furnish application forms and assist you in the completion of your claim. However, it is a good idea to know something about what information and proofs you will be asked to furnish. A telephone call to your social security office to find out what proofs are needed will solve the problem in most cases.

When you apply for payments on your own account, you will need proof of your age and the amount of your earnings for last year.

The best evidence of age is a birth certificate issued shortly after birth, but if you do not have a birth certificate, you can prove your age in a number of other ways. A baptismal record is almost as good as a birth certificate. Marriage certificates, birth records in family Bible, voting records, old insurance policies, and other old documents may also be acceptable. Usually, the social security office will be able to suggest some document that will be reasonably easy to get.

To furnish proof of your earnings, you can use your 1960 Form W-2 (withholding statement) if you worked for wages. If you are self-employed, bring a copy of your 1960 income tax return including the self-employment schedule.

If your wife is planning to file for benefits also, you should ask her to accompany you to the office. She will also need proof

Lent, A Good Season For Peanut Products

North Carolina homemakers will find the Lenten season a good time to step-up the use of peanuts and peanut products in menus.

Present indications are that the total supply of peanuts will be between 20 and 21 per cent in excess of domestic requirements this year. This means that peanut products, including peanut butter, peanut oil, and salted peanuts, will be plentiful during the coming months.

Peanuts—a concentrated food—are an excellent source of protein, as well as a good source of thiamine and niacin. When used in a mixed diet, they can serve as an excellent low-cost meat substitute. Peanut butter is by far the most popular of the peanut products. Although it is the peanut industry's gift to sandwich makers, peanut butter can also be used in many dishes, in hot breads, and cookies.

For a pleasant variety, try this recipe for 16 two-inch peanut butter biscuits. First, sift together 2 cups flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt and 2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder. Work in 2 tablespoons shortening and 1/4 cup peanut butter. Add about 1/4 cup milk slowly, stirring until a soft dough is formed. Knead

board, roll or pat to the desired thickness, and cut into biscuits. Bake on an ungreased baking sheet at 410 degrees for 15 minutes.

Try these variations for sandwich fillings:

1. Pineapple — One-half cup peanut butter, 1/2 cup drained crushed pineapple. Mix lightly.
2. Cranberry sauce — One-half cup peanut butter, 1/2 cup cranberry sauce. Mix lightly.
3. Date — One-half cup peanut butter, 1/2 cup chopped pitted dates, 1 teaspoon lemon juice, 1/2 cup cooked salad dressing, mix lightly.
4. Prune — One-half cup peanut butter, 1/2 cup chopped cooked prunes, 2 teaspoons lemon juice, 2 teaspoons prune juice. Blend well.
