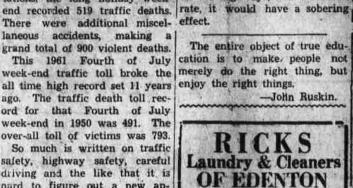

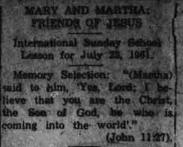

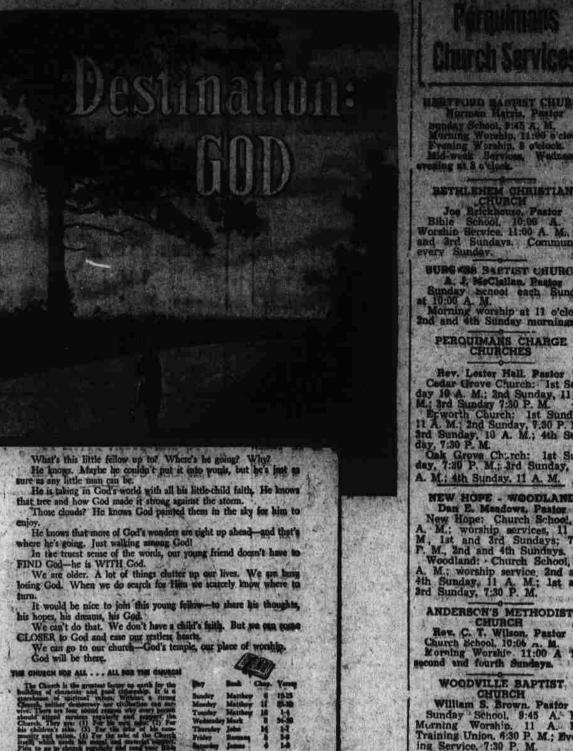

In the story of Martha and dary and Lazarus, we can find lumination, Lazarus, beloved of Jesus, died, and was rai from the dead. Martha, busy ministering to the Lord's needs in practical things, res Mary's listening to Jesus' t ings, rather than helping in the tchen. And, Jesus, when called upon by Martha to intervene in her behalf, instead rebarked Martha, albeit very gently, for being concerned over "many things," pointing out, equally gently, that Mary had ch 'the good portion"-the fruits of the spirit. Jesus, thereby, put his finger on the fundam of the spirit, rather than t trappings of physical comfort. And in this story, how many of us can find a parallel in our own lives today? Let us take a look at these people from Bethany, who were Jesus' friends. Not one seems

to have been famous, influential, or rich. They had faults, their troubles and their handicaps Yet they, with others who were but average individuals, be architects of a new world order Martha and Mary were as different as day and night; yet Jesus saw personality traits in both which could be especially valuable for work in the King dom. Different, too, were those whom Jesus first called: Peter was tempestuous and volatile Andrew quiet and dependat unassuming; John was war hearted and affectionate, Jan diffident and shy; and Mar as we have remarked, was b ling and matter-of-fact, while Mary was demure, retiring; thoughtful. God likes varie y; Jesus allowed each of his friends to retain and express his individuality. He knew that each could be a power for righteousness in his own way. The miracles begin when each of these persons gave Jesus Christ a chance with what he was. And so we naturally come to the question: How do we give Christ a chance with us? 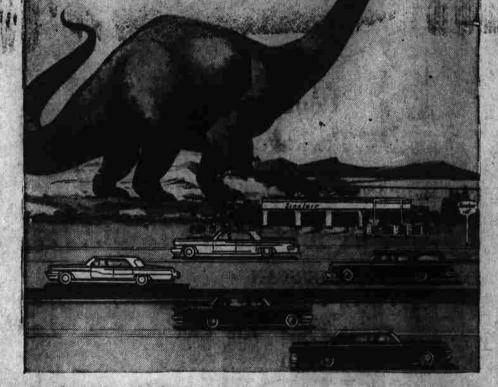
